

## Pipeline: Obama reveals that he isn't serious about jobs

Barack Obama has announced he will postpone for one year the decision on whether the U.S. will give approval to a Canadian-U.S. oil pipeline. This is quite odd for a man who claims we cannot wait on Congress to approve his jobs bill. The question is whether the federal government will allow the construction of the XL Keystone pipeline — 1,700 miles of pipeline to carry crude oil from Alberta, Canada to refineries in Texas.

Additionally, the Keystone XL pipeline would create 20,000 high-paying jobs and generate \$5 billion in tax revenues. No tax dollars are needed to fund this project. All that is needed is the government's approval for the project to move forward. But now the president who has said hundreds of times that he cannot wait, has decided to wait for a year.

Pipelines are historically safe. You may not realize it, but there are more than 168,000 miles of liquid pipelines throughout the nation safely and efficiently moving energy and raw materials that fuel our economy. In fact, there is an oil pipeline underground near my home. From walking in the woods and wading through the local streams near the pipeline, it is clear that it is environmentally safe. Additionally, there are more than 1.8 million miles of pipelines supplying natural gas to businesses and homes all across the nation. So a few more miles of pipeline cannot pose any real environmental problem.

Up until recently, the State Department was poised to approve of the Keystone XL pipeline. It was viewed as a huge economic plus, and it passed the environmental tests as well. But suddenly, the president who every day claims to be so concerned about job creation that he cannot wait for Congress, proves that it was all a cynical and disingenuous election year ploy.

The Obama Administration should have approved the Keystone XL pipeline. Doing so would have been evidence that Obama is doing something serious and not merely talking. But instead, Obama punted this decision until after the election — cynically thinking his liberal base will be pleased and that some moderate voters will hope he will approve the pipeline. There Obama goes again — voting "present" as he did 129 times while in the Illinois Senate. Sadly, Obama is all about politics and theatrics, not leadership.

Next time Obama blames Congress for not passing his jobs bill, you don't need to remember that for the first two years of his presidency he had a compliant Democrat-controlled Congress that blindly did his bidding, yet he did nothing to fix the economy.
